Supervisor Filipowicz opened the meeting. Sharon Mattison, Town Clerk led all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed for those serving in the military and our First Responders.

OPEN FORUM

PUBLIC HEARING, CLARKSON RENEWABLES, LLC SOLAR PROJECT

Mike Cucchiara of Nexamp, Inc. and Christopher Knox of Crawford & Associates Engineering, P.C. were present. M. Cucchiara reviewed the project details, namely a 6.5 megawatt solar project located on the west side of Lake Road about one-half mile north of the roundabout. This project would be able to serve over 400 residential homes as well as larger off-takers. Construction would take place over five to six months. There is tree cover around the project. A 20-foot gravel access road would be installed. There will be fairly minimal clearing to allow for utility poles and construction equipment. Plans were displayed with narration by C. Knox. The entire facility will be gated with a seven-foot fence. Life expectancy of the project is approximately 25 years. At end-of-life, decommissioning plans would leave the parcel as it was originally. The project will be solar only; no batteries.

Concerned residents in attendance included Ken and Nancy Hayward of 3895 Lake Road, Harold Mundy of 85 Mission Hill Drive, Ethan Dennis of 94 Sherwood Drive, and Shawn Lessord of 73 Valley View Drive. Issues discussed included the access roads, easements and setbacks, noise and lighting, maintenance and repairs, snow removal, safety, and esthetics. Drainage and stormwater management were also discussed. No disturbance in local wildlife is anticipated. Studies have shown that property values of homes in similar solar projects have not been impacted. Benefit to residents would be an approximate 10% discount with no enrollment or cancellation fees. The construction phase will be a busy time with equipment deliveries. The project team stated that they would be available to work with area residents to assist in resolving any concerns they might have.

R. Olson commented that notification has been submitted stating that the Town of Clarkson intends to enter into a pilot agreement with Nexamp, Inc. The next step, after approval of the overlay district, would be application to the Planning Board.

Filipowicz, Keylee Gilfilian, Leslie Zink and Tom Guarino attended the NYS training for *newly elected officials* last week. Our Little Library at Hafner Park was destroyed this past weekend, which was captured on our Highway security cameras A police report has been filed. Several community members have offered to donate books, money, and supplies to replace this library. P. Didas mentioned relocating the library so it was closer to Lake Road and more visible to the public. She met with Seymour Library officials regarding the final budget. Plans are being finalized for a copier replacement program for the Highway Office as well as downstairs and upstairs in the Town Hall. Plans have been initiated for transferring our telephone service from Frontier Communications Time Warner/Spectrum for a substantial savings. Late morning staff meetings have been initiated at the Town Hall to coincide with Town Board meeting dates. She recently awarded an Eagle Scout proclamation. Employee benefit summaries will be distributed soon. A draft winter safety day flyer was distributed, to be held on February 21st. We will assist with advertising.
