OLD BUSINESS

SWBR performed an Existing Conditions Report. Several items both interior and exterior were analyzed. The columns out front as well as the windows need to be repaired. Town Hall has received quotes for windows and doors in the building. The chimney needs to be repaired as well as the flue removed and capped off. The roof is in good shape as it had been replaced in 1997.

OPEN FORUM

Martha Clasquin of 34 Sherwood Dr. mentioned she had some issues trying to do the community survey online. Possible placement of an extra character might be causing some confusion. Councilperson Zink will look into this.

Solicitation Permits – have been declined at this time due to COVID.

Reassessment MOU – Assessor Liz Spencer estimated a cost of approximately \$30,000 for the clerk and commercial consultant. She will find out if the state is reimbursing for any of this. A spreadsheet of sales in Clarkson was provided to the Town Board members regarding house sales being, on average, 31% higher than assessed value.

Lifetime Assistance – has inquired about using a lodge during renovations of their building. This would run from July, 2021 – December 2021. This would involve 10 people, 2-3 days a week from 9a-3p doing mostly crafts and lunch. They would be using their own cleaning. The Board requested that our cleaner inspect the lodge to ensure that the cleaning is sufficient before granting approval for the entire 6-month period.

Supervisors Report –

Rabies Clinic – Councilpersons Zink, Guarino and Town Clerk Susan Henshaw all took part in the Clarkson/Hamlin Free Rabies Clinic this past Friday, May 14 at the Hamlin Town hall. It was a very successful event.

Wellington Woods North – Supervisor Filipowicz and Building Inspector Kevin Moore attended the ribbon cutting ceremony.

Comprehensive Plan's Community Survey is now live and can be accessed thru our town website.

Memorial Day Flag Ceremony – Supervisor Filipowicz and County Legislator Jackie Smith will be attending the Flag Ceremony at the Oliver Middle School.

Bike Rodeo - scheduled for June 26.

Renewables 2 – Supervisor Filipowicz contacted Mike Cucchiara via conference call live with Nexamp to discuss the community host agreement. The offer is for approximately \$130,000 which is roughly \$27,600 per Megawatt AC. This figure is based on 3 things: past assessments, pilot MPV and a donation. He states there have been changes in the past in regards to incentives. A higher value was discussed due to the market value put forward by the town. Mike Cucchiara said he would contact Supervisor Filipowicz once a decision has been made.

<u>Town Board Report</u> – Councilperson Zink advised that she contacted the Department of Health to discuss Clarkson Good Neighbor Days. They advised everything is in order and to continue to follow any guidelines and protocols for COVID. She is asking everyone to encourage others to take the Community Survey. The Town Board will be placing flags at the West Clarkson and Garland Cemeteries to honor our veterans for Memorial Day. Shred Day is coming up on Saturday June 5, from 10a – 12p at the highway parking lot.

<u>Superintendent Report -</u> Superintendent Viscardi advised that highway has started their summer county work which includes 4 drainage projects. First is the chip sealing of Lawton Rd. The highway has been and will continue spot patching town roads. Flags and Military banners will start to go up tomorrow. Brush bin seems to be very accommodating to our residents even after the move inside the gate. Superintendent Viscardi wishes to thank Supervisor Filipowicz and the Town Board for the approval to hire the 2 highway employees which bring him to full staff.

Building Inspector – Kevin Moore advised that everyone seems to be aware of all the big projects going on in Clarkson. He will be taking a training course on June 8 in regards to soil and water and keeping the town current. Conservation Board member John Barr wanted to thank the town for correcting the flood issue on his property. Once the pipe was removed that was not on the initial plans, things seemed to resolve itself.
