Hafner Park and New Town Hall: a vision for renewal and community connection

The Town of Clarkson is excited to share an update on the Hafner Park Improvements Project—an effort that also includes plans for a new Town Hall as part of our shared town campus. Since receiving a planning grant in late 2023 from the NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, we spent the months of April - September 2024 assessing the needs of the community by gathering public input and developing a forward-thinking vision for a central community space.

Community Voices Leading the Way

Your input has been instrumental. Through forums, surveys, and conversations, residents have told us how much Hafner Park means to families, seniors, and neighbors of all ages. Over 100 households provided thoughtful feedback, helping prioritize improvements and highlighting a strong desire to see the park become an even more welcoming destination. A feasibility study was prepared, and a concept plan was designed. Both can be reviewed on our website.

Top Priorities for Hafner Park

The concept plan proposes nine primary improvements to the park, and with the help of our engineers, MRB Group, we have applied for grants as they come available to help cover the cost:

- 1. Spray Park
- 2. New and relocated sports courts
- 3. Trails—multi-use walking and biking trails
- 4. Inclusive, upgraded playground improvements
- 5. Two accessible restroom buildings
- 6. Veterans Memorial
- 7. Amphitheater
- 8. Paving and sidewalk improvements
- 9. Stormwater drainage improvements

Other features most frequently requested by residents include:

- Covered pavilions and seating
- Improved lighting
- Outdoor fitness area
- Improved, inclusive dock at the pond

Maintenance, safety, and accessibility will also be addressed as part of the redesign.

The Town Hall Connection

A key element of this vision is a new Town Hall building in front of the existing Highway Department, adjacent to Hafner Park. A factor to move the vision along, was expedited by the interest of the USPS's visit to our Town Hall in August 2024, when they expressed interest in using the building as the new Clarkson Post Office site. We were told that the existing post office needs to be moved by March 31, 2026. The USPS is also considering a storefront in the Clarkson Corners Plaza, but while we wait for their decision, we wanted to push forward with the dream of creating a true civic campus at Hafner Park. It will make it easier for residents to access all town services while enjoying recreational amenities. Integrating the Town Hall with the park allows for better community events, shared green spaces, and improved access for all. The planning process is designed to make both the park and Town Hall accessible, efficient, and environmentally conscious.

Bringing the Vision to Life

The project's anticipated cost is approximately \$3.3 million for the entire park project, not including the new Town Hall. We are actively pursuing numerous local and state grants for the individual projects within Hafner Park. In addition, the Town possesses funds from local solar and incentive zoning projects that have been set aside for community improvements as well as the new Town Hall. A site plan is in the works, and a concept plan has been designed by MRB. See below.



Next Steps

The Town will provide ongoing updates to the public on the park progress and the new Town Hall, as well as the USPS's decision. We will look for opportunities for public involvement as plans progress, but feel free to check in with the Town Hall or our website for regular updates.

Our shared goal is to create a renewed civic center that will serve all residents for decades to come. Thank you for helping build the future of Clarkson's community spaces! Together, we are shaping a better Hafner Park and Town Hall for everyone.

Other Town News

- The WIBA #1 waterline project is still on schedule --- water service to all by the end of August!
- The three sidewalk projects on Lake Road, and the sidewalk on East Avenue are still on the agenda; it's just a matter of scheduling for our Highway Department to do the work.
- The Multi-golf project at Kimball Park is scheduled to be installed in August. More details to come!

I hope you continue to enjoy your summer – and hope to see many of you at Good Neighbor Day on Friday, August 15th.

CLARKSON'S CONSERVATION CORNER

The following is the inaugural informational article by the Clarkson Environmental Conservation Board. These articles will be presented quarterly and are intended to raise awareness of Conservation issues impacting all residents.

REDUCING BIRD-WINDOW COLLISIONS: A HOMEOWNERS GUIDE

A recent study conducted by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service estimates that approximately a billion birds are killed annually in collisions with buildings. Here in Clarkson, despite its rural character, birds are still at risk of building collisions, especially in more dense residential areas.

All birds are subject to colliding with windows. Migrating songbirds that we attract to bird feeders, are particularly vulnerable during migrating months March-June and August-November. Songbirds migrate at dawn and dusk; times when window reflections are most deceptive.

A recent study conducted at the University of Rochester (https://www.smashthecrashur.com/reports/) states "Collisions occur because windows are invisible to birds". The study is one of many attempts across the country to better understand what can be done to reduce bird collisions with buildings. Glass also reflects the outside environment resulting in birds mistaking it for a flight path followed by a collision; often fatal. Although birds may appear to be temporarily stunned after colliding with windows, they often die later due to internal injuries.

How can you help?

Bird collisions can be greatly reduced by bird-proofing your windows. Because birds are agile and can fly in small spaces it's important to create a visual barrier to your windows.

The most successful method follows the "two by two" rule which involves the application of decals at least ¼ inch in size to create a grid pattern spaced 2" apart both vertically and horizontally, with the grid pattern covering the entire surface of the window (see photo example). This method can be achieved by applying:

- Window film which is readily available in numerous patterns
- Decals, stickers, and masking tape that can be applied to the outside of windows.
- Your own artwork; be creative! Showcase your art by decorating windows with tempera paint or soap.

Other effective methods:

- Acopian Bird Savers ("Zen Curtains") are closely spaced cords that hang down over the outside of a window. This barrier is highly effective and can be aesthetically pleasing.
- Exterior window screens that cover the whole window.

Birds are crucial for maintaining healthy ecosystems. They play vital roles in pollination, seed dispersal, and pest control. Their presence benefits agricultural and natural environments while contributing to human well-being through the beauty and joy they bring.


The Town Clerk's office will still be open until 6:00 pm on Tuesdays.

What's YOUR number?

Check your house and mailbox and make sure your numbers are:

- 4 Inches tall or larger not less than a ½ inch in width, Arabic numbers- not script or text
- VISIBLE FROM THE STREET and with proper lighting
- As close to your front door as possible
- On a contrasting background
- On both sides of your mailbox
- · Unobstructed by trees or light fixtures

CELEBRATE THE ERIE CANAL BICENTENNIAL VOYAGE AT SANS SOUCI PARK!



The Town of Clarkson and the Clarkson Historical Commission are excited to announce a once-in-a-generation event! On Friday, September 26th, we'll welcome the Seneca Chief—a full-sized replica of the historic Erie Canal boat on its 200th Anniversary Bicentennial Voyage which also coincides with the opening of the Canal.

Join us at Sans Souci Park starting at 1:00 PM for a family-friendly community celebration, featuring:

- Historic programming and exhibits about the Erie Canal
- Food truck: ARMY EATS (veteran-owned and operated—don't miss their menu!)

The Seneca Chief will depart from Medina that morning, stopping in Brockport later in the day. Around 3:00–3:30 PM, the boat is expected to arrive in Clarkson. We invite everyone to help escort the ship into Brockport by walking along the canal—a scenic 3.3-mile route (about the distance of a 5K). All are welcome to join this unique community walk!

This event is part of a larger, statewide voyage commemorating 200 years since Governor DeWitt Clinton's original trip that united New York by water. Come be a part of history, enjoy great food, and celebrate our canal heritage with neighbors and friends!
